Person who has left their country and is seeking protection from persecution and serious human rights violations in another country, but who hasn't yet been legally recognized as a refugee and is waiting to receive a decision on their asylum claim.

is a complementary to the refugee status, it means that someone can not be returned to their country of origin or habitual residence, because they face a real risk of serious harm


